University of California garbanzo bean researchers will host a demonstration of their research trials on weed control, variety development, and disease resistance on Thursday, May 29, 2003, from 1:00 p.m. to 3:30 p.m. at the U.C. West Side Research and Extension Center. An optional visit to a research site on a grower's field will follow the field meeting.
